As I sit down to write this, we have just received the sad news of the death of Jeunesses Musicales Canada Honorary Chair Joseph Rouleau. Mr. Rouleau's dedication and boundless generosity have left an indelible mark on our organization. Throughout his time as Chair of Jeunesses Musicales Canada, truly a role of a lifetime which he held for 25 years, he supported a great number of opera singers, instrumentalists, and composers. We thank our dear friend Joseph and his wife Renée for their unwavering commitment to our mission.

Throughout the year, thanks to generous donors and special fundraising events, and under the leadership of Chair Richard Lupien, the JMC Foundation was once again in a position to provide JMC with very significant financial support. We are deeply grateful to the foundation for this work. YEAR 4: THE END OF A CHAPTER AND A NEW BEGINNING



General and Artistic Director

With our first ever Strategic Plan now behind us, we are seeing encouraging results and major successes. In action, a strategic plan is constantly evolving, and rarely are the goals set out at the beginning 100% achieved by the end of the period. However, by keeping that in mind and using analysis and flexibility to adapt our focus, we can continue to transition our goals to better align with a changing landscape.

I am very proud to present the results of our 2015-2019 Strategic Plan, with an 85% success rate with regards to the goals it originally set out. Only one of the strategic pillars was dropped (the digital component, due to a lack of time and resources) and only one project, the pan-Canadian Maureen Forrester Award Tour, did not come to fruition due to a lack of funding. All in all, the year-end report is positive and features extensive growth in our educational workshops and local facilitator training in New Brunswick and Jonquière.

The 2018-2019 season was all about consolidation. The newest members of our staff completed their first full cycle with us, new relationships were established with newcomers, and our many workshop projects were successfully developed. We are seeing results from New Brunswick's involvement in this area, and an increasing number of partnerships are cropping up. Our facilitation model is becoming a powerful tool to raise awareness of classical music among youth, and that is what we will continue to do over the next four seasons.

I would like to thank my entire team at JMC, the many board members who support me, and you, JMC Centre volunteers, who keep this musical flame alive in your area. Your thorough understanding of your environment allows us to become a part of your respective communities' artistic and cultural DNA, which directly contributes to the vibrancy of Jeunesses Musicales Canada's mission

IN MEMORIAM: JOSEPH ROULEAU, CC, GOQ, COM, AL, DHC

Although it occurred during the 2019-2020 Jeunesses Musicales Canada season, the death of Joseph Rouleau on July 12, 2009 at the age of 90 marked the end of a long and illustrious relationship between JMC and its Honorary Chair. Joseph's importance in our organization's history, and as a cultural figure in general, calls for a tribute to his career and the indelible mark he left on us.

Born in Matane in 1929, Joseph dabbled in voice studies, eventually entering the Conservatoire de musique du Québec à Montréal after meeting Wilfrid Pelletier who encouraged him to pursue his training. Joseph was the Conservatory's first ever voice student.

In 1960, he made his debut at the Opéra de Paris, performing alongside Dame Joan Sutherland in Donizetti's *Lucia di Lammermoor*. He went on to sing with the Canadian Opera Company, where he performed Ramfis in Verdi's *Aida*, Basilio in Rossini's *Il barbiere di Siviglia* and premiered the role of Bishop Taché in *Louis Riel* by Harry Sommers. In 1984, he made his Metropolitan Opera debut as the Grand Inquisitor in Verdi's *Don Carlos*. His career took him to some of the greatest stages in the world, where he sang alongside world-renowned artists including Luciano Pavarotti, Joan Sutherland, Marilyn Horne and Montserrat Caballé.

Upon his return to Quebec in the late 1970s, he founded the Mouvement pour l'art lyrique du Québec, which would pave the way for the Opéra de Montréal, the Opéra de Québec and the Atelier lyrique de l'Opéra de Montréal. He also founded the voice studio at Université du Québec à Montréal, which led to a premiere of Jacques Hétu's opera *Le Prix* with libretto by Yves Beauchemin.

17-stop recital tour through the newly network alongside pianist John Newmark. This first engagement led him to pursue further vocal training opportunities in Milan in 1952. Three years later, he secured a series of engagements with the New Orleans Opera and, shortly thereafter, auditioned for the Guest Director of the Royal Opera House (ROH). Before making his London debut, he toured with the company in Cardiff, Manchester, and Southampton. He enjoyed an illustrious first season at ROH: in addition to La Bohème, he sang Sarastro in Mozart's Die Berlioz's Les Troyens, and Verdi roles including Ferrando in *Il trovatore* and Sparafucile in *Rigoletto*. He returned to Canada in 1956 and made his Opera Guild of Montreal debut as Philip II in Don Carlos, which would become one of his signature roles. His time at the Royal Opera House led to roles in over 50 opera productions and over 1,000

In 1989, Joseph was elected Chair of Jeunesses Musicales Canada at the JMC Annual General Meeting. His involvement with the JMC Foundation helped generate renewed support, and he served as its Interim Director, encouraging increased commitment among JMC board members. In 1994, at the invitation of André Bourbeau, Joseph became artistically involved in the Dunham Dinner-Concert events, which would become a major fundraising event for JM Canada for 21 years. He also spearheaded the creation of the Joseph Rouleau Award in 1994, which turned into the Concours musical influence for which the competition is now known. For 25 years, Joseph Rouleau has worked tirelessly to ensure the relevance of Jeunesses Musicales Canada, to develop its network and its Foundation.

During Joseph's tenure as JMC Chair, he oversaw the acquisition of JMC's brick-and-mortar head office; helped establish a Foundation that has since increased its assets tenfold and grown to support many of Jeunesses Musicales Canada's activities in addition to numerous emerging artists; and contributed to an impressive local, provincial, national and international reach.

We will leave him with the last word, by way of a recent quote from a speech he made at our Coup de Coeur event in May 2019:

"In 1951, when Jeunesses Musicales Canada was just barely in its second year, Gilles Lefebvre offered me my first ever 17-stop recital tour through the JMC network. It marked the beginning of a long and successful career for me. My dear friends, I honour your commitment, not only today but also tomorrow, which I already dare foresee. I am counting on you for the rest. Your loyalty ensures the sustainability of our organization. Without you, the music of JMC would have stopped playing a long time ago. Long live JMC!"

MANDATE

Since 1949, Jeunesses Musicales Canada (JMC) has produced, presented and disseminated professional concerts in outlying areas outside of major urban centres, thanks notably to a network of 250 local volunteers who help produce its touring concerts in halls and schools.

Administration of these activities takes place in the heart of Plateau Mont-Royal, in a building deemed a "Significant Architectural Landmark" by the City of Montreal; a special space dedicated to musical discovery and production.

MISSION

Jeunesses Musicales Canada is a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to promote the dissemination of classical music, particularly among young people, and to support emerging professional musicians and composers in the development of their careers, both nationally and internationally.

Jeunesses Musicales Canada achieves this mission through a network of volunteers who host its tours and handle local promotion, ticketing and outreach.

VISION

To be recognized as a pan-Canadian benchmark for springboarding emerging artists, and to work to increase the accessibility of classical music.



BRIEF HISTORY

Founded in 1949 by Gilles Lefebvre.

Headquartered in Montreal's Plateau Mont-Royal, with current offices opened in April 2000.

21 volunteer-run JMC Chapters across Ontario, Quebec, and New Brunswick.

A network of over 250 Canadian volunteers dedicated to making classical music accessible outside of major urban centres.

A network of over 350 buyers.

A presence in 6 provinces.

Member of an international network (Jeunesses Musicales International) whose mission is to bring music to youth.

Since 1950, JMC has hosted 6 international Jeunesses Musicales International general meetings and contributed to the success of the Jeunesses Musicales World Orchestra.

The Jeunesses Musicales Canada Foundation was created in 1984 to support JMC's musical activities.

An impressive range of Canadian artists have made their debut with JMC before going on to have illustrious national and international careers: singers Joseph Rouleau, Louis Quilico and Maureen Forrester, and more recently Marie-Nicole Lemieux and Marc Hervieux; pianists John Newmark, Charles Reiner and Charles Richard-Hamelin; and string players Denis Brott, Angèle Dubeau, James Ehnes, Andrew Wan and Stéphane Tétreault.




Other JMC team successes worth mentioning, in no particular order:

- Creation and pre-production for Zoum-boum-boum, a concert designed to introduce toddlers ages 2 to 6 to electroacoustic music through the adventures of Sam and Charlie, who have fun using day-to-day sounds to drive their playtime. This wordless, sonic adventure features an unusual contemporary work composed by Stephanie Moore, based on a concept developed by Alexis Diamond.
- Retention of a new recurring tenant for Joseph Rouleau Hall for the regular presentation of conferences, now our most frequent renter.
- Purchase of young audience concerts by 8 new buyers (4 schools and 4 presenters) outside Montreal and 1 new buyer in Montreal;
- Project development in partnership with Commission scolaire de Montréal and preschool classes representing 270 music initiation workshops for 3,900 children in 45 preschool classes;
- Development of activities for special needs classes;
- Development of two new locations in New Brunswick Moncton and Edmundston which contributed to 600 children participating in 65 activities across the two new locations.
- Development of a digital workshop with a team of 3 digital facilitators: Benoit Côté, Véronique Girard & Aurélie Négrier. Two phases of development:
 - test workshop in Alain Bisson's class at École Notre-Dame-de-Grâce on June 18, 2019:
 - full 8-workshop pilot project in September through the Portages de l'Outaouais school board (École secondaire Grandes Rivières).
- Increase in Escapades musicales (school outings to Joseph Rouleau Hall), with a total of 118 performances (72 for 3 to 5 year-olds and 57 for 6 to 12 year-olds) and an average surplus margin of 32%.
- Significant success of Opera Candy young audience concert, presented at the Théâtre Outremont, with 5 performances and total attendance of 1.784.

FRANCE BELLEMARE



The 2018-2019 season was a successful one for soprano France Bellemare (2013-2014 JMC Artist). In addition to singing Micaëla in Opéra de Montréal's production of *Carmen* directed by Charles Binamé, she sang the role of Mimi in *La Bohème* at Vancouver Opera. She also made her debut with Cincinnati Opera in *Another Brick in the Wall*.

PHILIP CHIU



Artist-in-residence at Cecilia Concerts in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Philip Chiu (2017-2018 JMC Artist) recorded an album with cellist Cameron Crozman entitled *Cavatine* based on their *Bons baisers de France* concert tour. The record was received very positively by critics, who praised Philip's excellent work as a collaborative pianist.

CAMERON CROZMAN



Cellist and 2017-2018 JMC Artist Cameron Crozman put out his first album under the ATMA Classique label, *Cavatine*. French magazine *Diapason* gave the record five tuning forks. Since returning to Canada, Cameron has travelled across Canada as a guest soloist and currently plays the "Bonjour" Stradivarius cello from c. 1696 and the Adam "Shaw" bow from c. 1830, on loan from the Canada Council for the Arts Instrument Bank.

MARCEL D'ENTREMONT



Tenor Marcel d'Entremont won the \$25,000 Wirth Vocal Prize from McGill University's Schulich School of Music. A 2016-2017 JMC Artist, he also performed Pamino in McGill's production of *Die Zauberflöte*, and was a Jeune Ambassadeur Lyrique at the Lyrichoregra competition. He also holds a Master's degree in Voice.

CHRISTOPHER DUNHAM



Christopher Dunham had a successful year that culminated in a performance of Toreador in the Opéra de Montréal production of *Carmen*. From a recital in Atlanta to the title role in Southern Ontario Lyric Opera's production of *Don Giovanni*, the baritone and 2016-2017 JMC Artist is currently focusing on developing his North American career and preparing for major international competitions in the upcoming season.

Violinist and 1994-1995 JMC Artist James Ehnes won a 2019 Grammy Award in the "Classical Instrumental Solo" category for his recording of the Aaron Jay Kernis Violin Concerto with the Seattle Symphony, conducted by Ludovic Morlot.

Harpsichordist Mélisande McNabney (2015-2016 JMC Artist) released *Inspirations*, her first solo album under the ATMA Classique label, featuring works by the beloved French composers of the Baroque period.

Pianist and 2015-2016 JMC Artist Charles Richard-Hamelin won a Juno for "Classical Album of the Year: Solo or Chamber" for his recording of Beethoven's Sonatas for Violin no. 6, 7 and 8, featuring Andrew Wan on violin. He also won the Opus Award for Performer of the Year which came with a \$5,000 grant from the Canada Council for the Arts.

JOSEPH ROULEAU



On May 17, JMC Honorary Chair and bass singer Joseph Rouleau was awarded a Commander medal of the Ordre de Montréal in the presence of Mayor Valérie Plante in recognition of his longspanning career and involvement in the development of the arts in Montreal.

ORIOL TOMAS



Director Oriol Tomas, who directed JMC's 2017-2018 production of *Don Giovanni*, was in high demand in 2018-2019. He directed contemporary opera *Twenty Seven* for Opéra de Montréal and *La Traviata* for Icelandic Opera, and he brought his vision of *Don Giovanni* to Edmonton Opera and Manitoba Opera.







YOUNG AUDIENCE / FAMILY CONCERTS

A new production was launched in fall 2018: *The Beginnings of Bing Bang!*, a theatrical concert designed to teach youth about the passing down of rhythmic traditions from one culture to the next.

The final performances of *Fred Piston and his 7 Trumpets* took place at Joseph Rouleau Hall from November 11 to 16. This concert has been performed 559 times since its premiere in 2007. Two of our productions were finalists for this year's Opus Awards: *Opera Candy* and *Le chant de l'alouette*.

Several concerts have enjoyed significant tours:

- A World for Christmas: 9 concerts at the Agora des arts de Rouyn-Noranda
- Opera Candy: the Gourmet Adventures of Hansel and Gretel: 3 performances in Dalhousie and 5 performances at the Festival d'opéra de Québec
- Lute, Friend of Kings, presented during the Festival de musique baroque de Lamèque.
- In collaboration with MASC in Ottawa, seven concerts were presented: Giggle and Stomp! (2), The Great Rythmobile Adventure (4) and The Beginnings of Bing Bang! (1).





WORKSHOPS

The 2018-2019 season saw the development of a new partnership with Commission scolaire de Jonquière. A series of 35 workshops were presented in 17 schools by Clio Théodoridis, the new facilitator for Saguenay region. A new partnership with the Commission scolaire de Montréal resulted in a significant uptick in our early childhood education offering, with 270 workshops in 2018-2019 as compared to 54 in 2017-2018.

Through a partnership between ATMA, COSIMU and JMC, a new digital workshop will launch next fall. *Classicofone* is JMC's first ever digital workshop. A pilot version was held on June 18 at École Notre-Dame-de-Grâce (Commission scolaire de Montréal) with the 25 students in Alain Bisson's class. Two facilitators, Véronique Girard and Aurélie Négrier, received training as part of this pilot workshop.

Four workshops were delivered in collaboration with École L.H. Lafontaine to go along with a new concert focusing on Indigenous culture. Amélie Dionne's Grade 5 class actively participated in the creation of *The Ones Who Dream*. The teacher's involvement in the process alongside the JMC team and designer and consultant Nathalie Picard contributed significantly to the success of these workshops. The workshops invited the youth to record their dreams in a journal, either as a story, poem, music or drawing. Many of these dreams were used in the script for the staged concert and the drawings and collages created by the youth based on the themes in their dreams will be used to inform set design. In addition, during the fourth workshop, the youth participated in creating a nature-inspired symphony that will be featured in the concert.

As part of the rollout of young audience activities in New Brunswick, two new facilitators, Jessie and Justine, joined the team for Edmundston and Fredericton. Myriam Poitras previously developed the Moncton area in 2018-2019. Early childhood education activities were developed with the Fredericton-based arts facilitators, and 42 workshops were delivered in the Bâtisseurs and Éclaireurs kindergartens.

In the preschool category, a total of 10,892 children participated in our workshops, an increase of nearly 25% over the previous season.



2019-2023 STRATEGIC PLAN

In March 2017, the JMC team, partners and volunteer network started taking the first steps toward a major organizational development evaluation project. Several internal and external committees were struck and tasked with reflecting on the challenges of disseminating classical music, JMC's place in this ever-changing landscape, and the role we will play in the coming years. A finalized plan, including strategic orientations, focus, objectives, success indicators and timelines, was presented to the Board of Directors for approval on February 27, 2019.

This second strategic plan clearly focuses on our regional centres and partners, of which you form the core. The planning process was intense both in terms of its duration (2 years) and the work involved, which included internal and external consultations, surveys, orientation meetings, ad hoc committees, participatory workshops, etc. The process was conducted in the most rigorous, critical and consultative manner possible. It is with deep sadness that Jeunesses Musicales Canada learned last April of the death of Hélène Gaudet-Lessard, a key volunteer in our JMC Chapter network. As a teacher by trade, her passion for sharing and learning new information stayed with her for her whole life. A strong defender of music, she even founded a private piano school, offering the possibility of home lessons to young people in more remote areas. Recipient of the Queen's Silver Jubilee Medal in 2012, Hélène Gaudet-Lessard made a significant contribution to the promotion of music in the region. We pay tribute and thank her for her determination, curiosity, dedication to others and love of music and culture.



MONTREAL VOLUNTEERS





ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

Between October and December 2018, Jeunesses Musicales Canada conducted its first annual fundraising campaign. The goal was to develop philanthropic culture in the organization, to strengthen our network, to solicit information that would allow better subsequent asks, and to highlight the impact of the donation on the JMC structure.

Two \$1,000+ donors, three \$500+ donors, eight \$250+ donors, and 20 donors in the \$249 and under category contributed to this first initiative.

In total, JMC raised \$7,590 from 34 donors, which will directly fund our musical activities.

JEUNESSES MUSICALES CANADA FOUNDATION

COUP DE CŒUR EVENT, 4TH EDITION

The fourth edition of our Coup de Coeur fundraising event took place at The Windsor Ballrooms on May 2, 2019, raising \$90,000. 250 people joined Marc Hervieux and his guests for this exceptional fundraising event. Guest artists included tenor Marcel d'Entremont, soprano Myriam Leblanc, mezzo-soprano Caroline Gélinas and pianists Marie-Ève Scarfone and Michel-Alexandre Broekaert.

The purpose of the Coup de Coeur event is to showcase a renowned artist who got his or her professional start with Jeunesses Musicales Canada. This year, the Award honoured tenor Marc Hervieux.

The André Bourbeau Mentorship Prize was awarded to emerging tenor Marcel d'Entremont. This will give him the opportunity to be mentored by Marc Hervieux. This award was sponsored by the National Bank of Canada. The award also comes with the \$1,000 Vanda Treiser Scholarship.

FOUNDATION AWARDS

Once again, the Foundation presented several awards this season, including the \$6,500 Choquette-Symcox Award to tenor Marcel d'Entremont and the \$2,500 2018 Peter Mendell Award to violinist Teresa Wang of McGill University's Schulich School of Music. Through the AIDA Fund, the JMC Foundation also awarded nearly \$164,000 in scholarships to organizations and emerging professionals for career and musical activity development projects.

GOLF TOURNAMENT 2018

The Foundation's second fundraising event, our annual golf tournament chaired by Joseph Rouleau, raised nearly \$100,000 this year. 88 players enjoyed a magnificent day at the Club de golf de la Vallée-du-Richelieu as well as a very fruitful evening of music and socializing featuring tenor Marcel d'Entremont and pianist Louise-Andrée Baril.

JOSEPH ROULEAU/ANDRÉ BOURBEAU FUND

Amounts deposited in the Joseph Rouleau/André Bourbeau Endowment Fund are used to support JMC activities, with a minimum of 3.5% of the principal paid out to JMC on an annual basis. In 2018-19, donations to this fund were matched through the Mécénat Placements Culture program via the Quebec Ministry of Culture and Communications (\$449,279), as well as through the Department of Canadian Heritage's Canada Cultural Investment Fund (\$96,644).

The total accumulated amount of the fund as of June 30, 2019 was \$1,790,330, not including the \$449,279 in matching funds which are receivable in fall 2019.

Thanks in part to our Foundation President Richard Lupien, the First-time Major Cultural Donations campaign was extended to December 31, 2022.

JEUNESSES MUSICALES NEW BRUNSWICK - ANNUAL REPORT

Perhaps the most significant event of the year was the Jeunesses Musicales Canada AGM, which took place in Edmundston from September 28 to 30. Our Edmundston hosts spared no effort and went to great lengths to make their guests feel welcome. And they succeeded. In addition to a warm Brayon-style welcome and the enthusiastic participation of numerous volunteers from JMC Chapters in Quebec and New Brunswick, the presence of most of the Board of Directors and virtually the entire JMC staff helped to set a festive vibe reminiscent of a large family gathering from the Friday evening reception all the way to the Sunday morning visit to the Edmunston Arts Centre. The weekend will not be soon forgotten.

At the Jeunesses Musicales New Brunswick AGM held at the Université de Moncton Faculty of Music on October 27, Treasurer Ron Jessome announced his retirement after a four year term on the Board. To fill the vacant position, Malaïka Bacon-Dussault was elected as an external director. Malaïka is a lawyer and law professor at the Université de Moncton. Pauline Banville-Pérusse was elected Treasurer, while Wilfred Alliston, Luc Gagnon and Adrienne Deveau were re-elected for one-year terms as Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary respectively.

The AGM also endorsed the recommendations of the ad hoc committee set up to examine the policies around the Laetitia Cyr Scholarships. While staying within the overall cap set by the Board, the jury will now decide on the quantity and value of scholarships. Applications were open from January 15 to April 15, and winners were announced on May 15.

The jury was made up of Nadia Bérubé, violin teacher and teacher at Collège communautaire du Nouveau-Brunswick in Edmundston; Lucille Ouellette, pianist and keyboard/classical piano teacher at Cégep de Saint-Laurent in Montreal; Myriam Poitras, soprano and director of the Mimi Musique school in Dieppe; Lisa Roy, professor of voice, vocal pedagogy and opera at the Faculty of Music of the Université de Moncton, and Martin Waltz, retired musician and former Head of the Faculty of Music, also at the Université de Moncton.

The jury awarded three scholarships. The recipients were:

- Sasha Léger, composer: \$1,700 grant to attend the summer program at the Film Scoring Academy of Europe in Sofia, Bulgaria;
- Brooklyn Duffie, pianist: \$800 scholarship to attend the Orford Music Academy in Quebec;
- Martine Jomphe, pianist: \$500 scholarship to attend the Académie de l'été musical de Barachois in New Brunswick.

Throughout the course of the year, new activities were rolled out in various parts of the province. As part of the Baroque Festival, *Lute, Friend of Kings*, a young audience concert, was presented in Lamèque in July. Music initiation and creation workshops, originally launched in 2017 in Fredericton, were brought to Edmundston in the fall of 2018, and then to Dieppe, Moncton and Caraquet in the early months of 2019. These toddler-oriented workshops included *Body Beats* (creation), *Do-it-yourself Music: Clarinet* (creation), *Sing me a Story* (music initiation) and *A Rhythmic Trip around the World* (music initiation). In March, *Opera Candy* toured three schools in the Campbellton-Dalhousie area. In April, in an inaugural collaboration with the Multicultural Association of Fredericton, our Fredericton Chapter presented a concert by the Ladom Ensemble to some 50 newcomer children and adults.

The three-year operating grant from the Ministry of Culture for 2016-2019 expired in the spring. In our most recent application for the 2019-2022 period, JMNB requested the maximum grant of \$20,000 per year, an amount we feel is easily justified for this period by our the scope of our various projects, which included a province-wide expansion of our music initiation workshops, the revival of the Emerging Artist Tour in 2020, and the development of a scholarship program to support students pursuing postsecondary classical music education. Unfortunately, JMNB fell victim to budget cuts and our annual grant will remain at \$7,830 for the next three years.

JMNB was able to keep Development Officer Jessie Guerrette on from October until the end of May, at which time she had to leave us to pursue other musical projects. Jessie coordinated the Laetitia Cyr Scholarship Competition and, among other things, oversaw media relations, organized and recorded meetings, reported on the 2018-2019 grant and prepared the 2019-2022 three-year application for operating funding. In addition to her administrative duties, she facilitated music initiation workshops in Edmundston and Caraquet. Over the past two years, Jeunesses Musicales' activities in New Brunswick have expanded, made possible in large part by a local permanent position that facilitates networking, activity coordination and service provision.

Thanks to Canada Summer Jobs, JMNB was in a position to hire a student to take over from Jessie for a period of eight weeks, from May 27 to July 19. Naomi Ouellet is a graduate of the Faculty of Music at the Université de Moncton and a Master's candidate in Musicology at McGill University. As a soprano, she performed as part of the Emerging Artist Tour in March 2018. She was quick to immerse herself in JMNB's files and held her own as an organizer, graphic designer and writer. Her resourcefulness ensured a smooth transition toward the next chapter.

In conclusion, JMNB continues to pursue its mission of promoting classical music and emerging artists both locally and internationally. Our organization's success continues to depend on active collaboration between the seven JMC Chapters as well as our loyal audience community.

Over the course of the past season, we experienced certain events that had an impact on JMC in general and on the Life of the Movement Committee in particular. For the committee, I am referring specifically to the resignation of Marie-Claude Fortin, an extremely dedicated staff member and a key pillar in leading the Life of the Movement Committee. Her position was filled by Émilien Roscanu, and we have full confidence he will be up to the task. For this reason, the committee held only two meetings this year. Nevertheless, important points were discussed, such as the 2019-2023 Strategic Plan, updates, and next steps.

The meetings were held by conference call on September 6, 2018 and June 6, 2019 respectively.

COMMITTEE CONFERENCE CALL - SEPTEMBER 6, 2018

During this conference call, we started by reviewing nominations for the 2018 Volunteer Award. Four names were selected. Next, we reviewed the tentative schedule for the AGM. It was decided that members who cannot attend the AGM may pass along their voting rights to a person of their choice via a proxy form. Finally, we discussed various ways of attracting new audiences to the Emerging Artists Concerts.

COMMITTEE CONFERENCE CALL - JUNE 6, 2019

After being welcomed by the committee, Émilien Roscanu introduced himself. Danièle LeBlanc then shared the Strategic Plan approved at the JMC Board of Directors' meeting on February 27, and provided an overview of next steps. Afterwards, the preliminary schedule for the upcoming Annual General Meeting at Domaine Forget was presented to the committee members. New ways to increase the number of concerts for young audiences were discussed. It was suggested that presenters who are proactive at the young audience level be invited to speak at the AGM. There was discussion of creating an Achievement Award as a way to recognize Joseph Rouleau's career at the upcoming AGM. Finally, it was suggested that a way be found to reward all volunteers every year.

Updated audition process:

Candidates for Emerging Artists Concerts had to submit video recordings of three (3) pieces from their proposed repertoire list, accompanied by spoken introductions. Candidates for the opera had to submit videos with specific arias from each of the roles.

Updated jury evaluation process:

Step 1: Once the applications were received, jury members were invited to listen to all the videos submitted by the candidates. (Approximately twenty hours' worth).

Step 2: After listening to the recordings, each jury member had to complete an Excel document in which they indicated "yes", "no", or "maybe" and provided supporting comments for each candidate.

Step 3: Jury members' decisions were collated.

Step 4: A final jury consultation meeting was held to approve selected candidates, held at Jeunesses Musicales Canada offices on November 16, 2018 (by teleconference for those outside the city).

At each audition, the presence and collaboration of experienced jury members ensured valuable discussion and excellent recommendations.

I really enjoyed the experience of these video-based auditions, because it avoided having to make the trip to Montreal for auditions, instead giving me the flexibility to do it from the comfort of my own home. In addition, this way of doing things made it easier to listen to the auditions and to replay them as desired. The evaluation tool, an Excel spreadsheet, was very easy to use and provided a nice overview of the jury members' evaluations.

However, during the plenary session, which took place in the conference room at the JMC offices, it would have been better if I had been able to participate in person rather than alone by phone. This would have allowed me to better contribute to discussions, share opinions and participate in the process. Another area for improvement would be to gather feedback from the jury about the evaluation process.

JEUNESSES MUSICALES INTERNATIONAL - ANNUAL REPORT

Jeunesses Musicales Canada once again participated in JMI activities via the Classical Music Committee meetings. The Classical Music Committee has been working on the *New Ways in Classical Music* project for over two years now. The committee is made up of members from Germany, Croatia, Denmark, Spain, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Spain, and Canada.

This formed the setting for the creation of the enCORE New ways in Classical Music program.

The program is designed to engage young classical musicians who wish to play an active role in society and become classical music ambassadors.



The program is based on informal and interactive learning methods as well as peer-to-peer education. Through a series of interactive lectures, the program addresses current gaps in formal music education systems and aims to inspire, support, and empower youth to explore new ways of playing and sharing classical music and to seek new methods of interacting with audiences (new or youth). These events will bring together international experts from various relevant fields and participants from all over the world for thoughtful discussions and experience sharing.

An inaugural interactive conference took place in Berlin from March 9 to 12, 2019 with 33 young musicians from various JMI member countries. Two emerging Canadian pianists participated in the event: Meagan Milatz and Elisabeth Pion. This pilot event was very successful and allowed us to lay the

groundwork for upcoming enCORE program activities.

A two-day event exploring the theme "Music without Borders" was hosted last July by Jeunesses Musicales Poland. About fifteen musicians attended this event in Warsaw.

The next edition of this annual event will take place in Barcelona in March 2020.

In addition, five young musicians will be invited to attend the JM Global conference at next year's JMI AGM. In addition to performing, they will be given an opportunity to present the *enCORE* program to the JMI member countries.

The Jeunesses Musicales International Annual General Meeting will exceptionally be held later than usual next year. Hosted by Jeunesses Musicales China, the AGM will take place October 30 to November 5, 2019 in Suzhou. Executive and Artistic Director Danièle LeBlanc and JMC Chair Jean-Guy Gingras will be in attendance to represent Jeunesses Musicales Canada.
